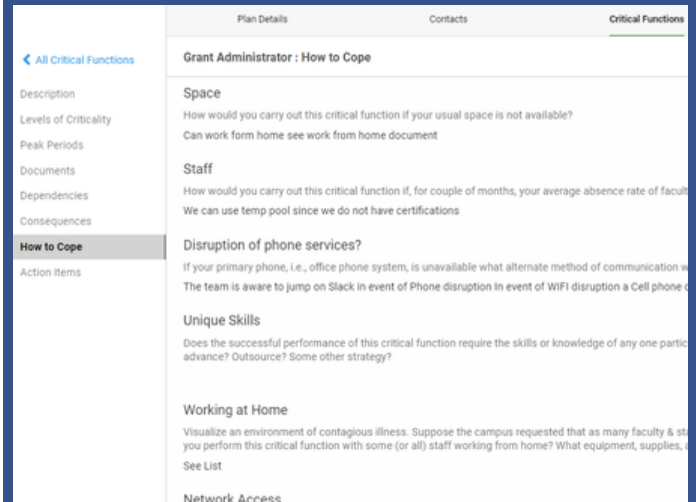
By proactively addressing these considerations and exploring all available options, we can enhance our ability to cope with unexpected challenges and maintain the continuity of our critical functions.
